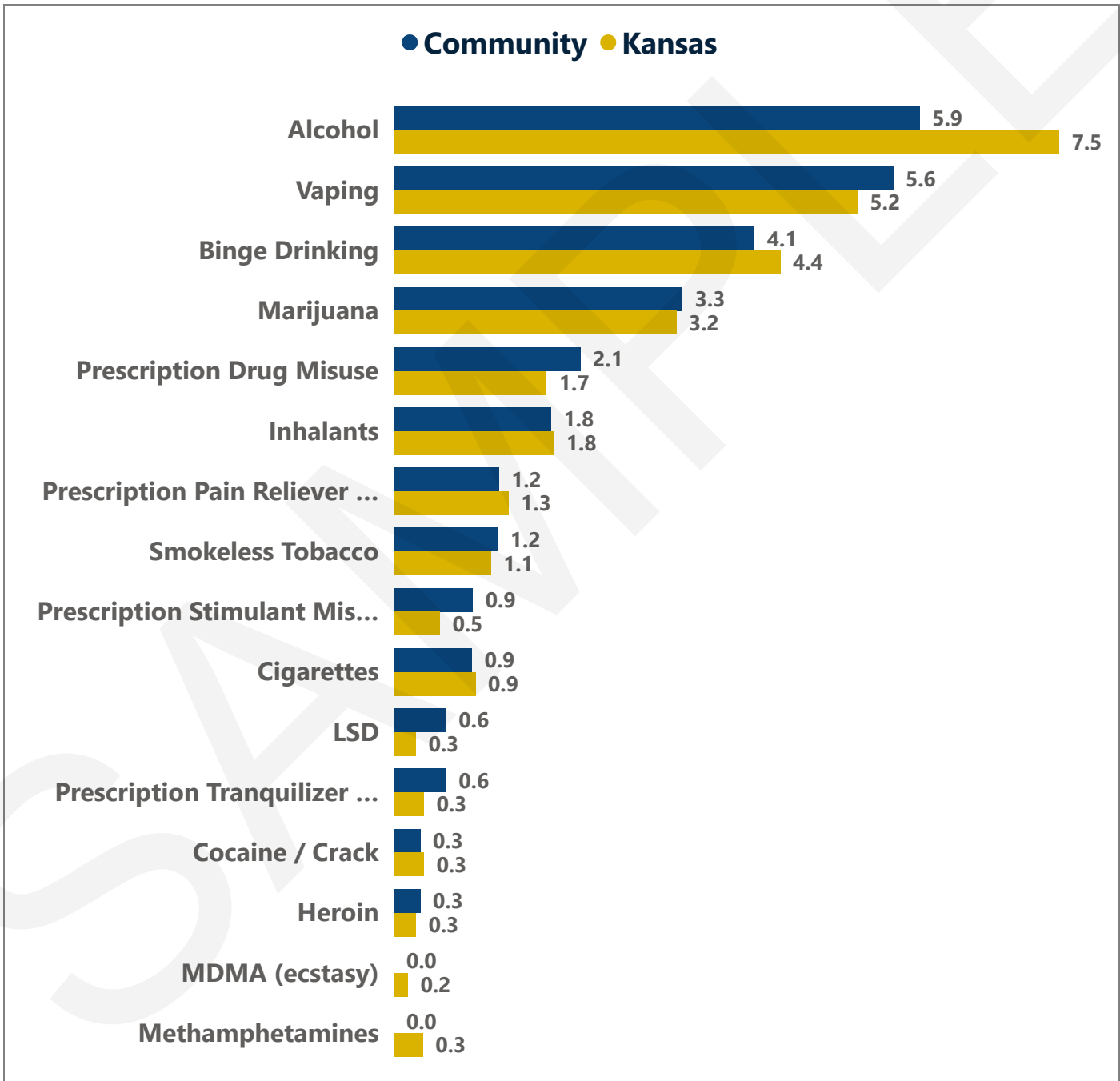

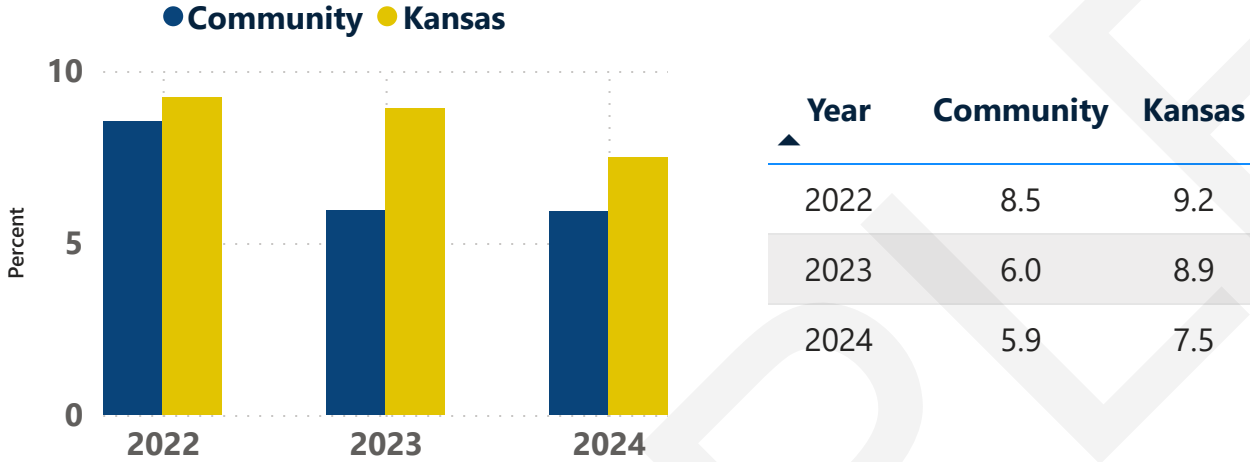

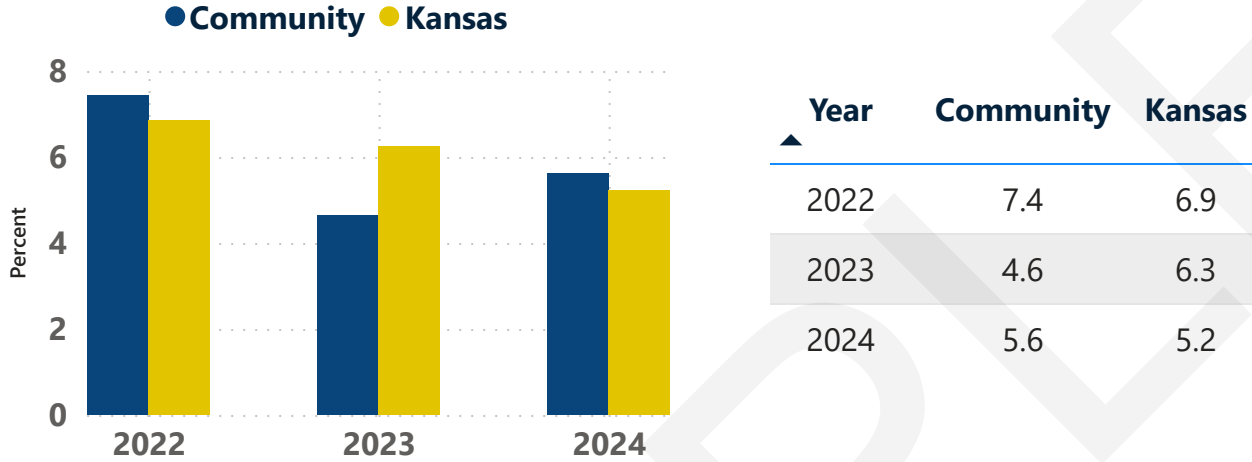

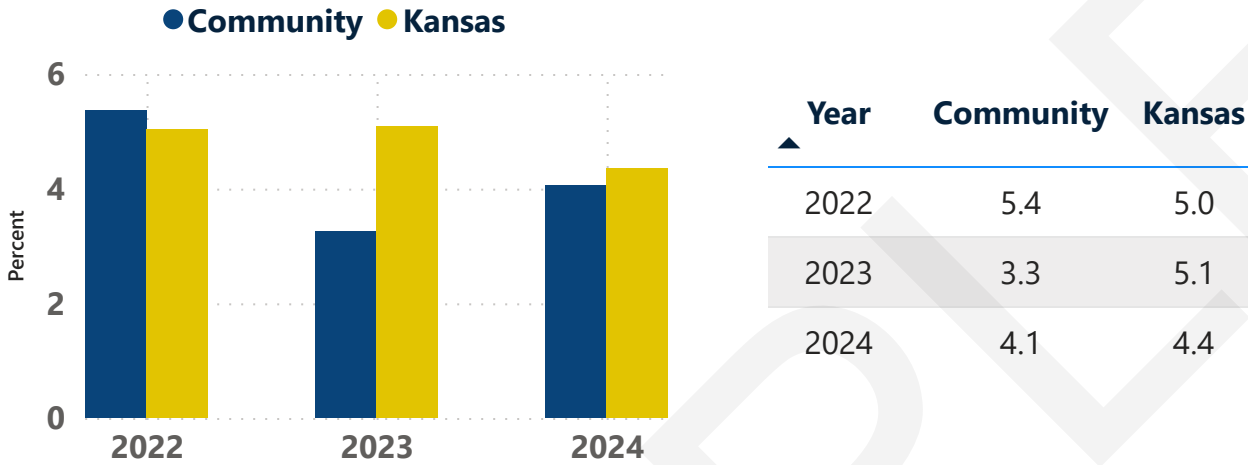

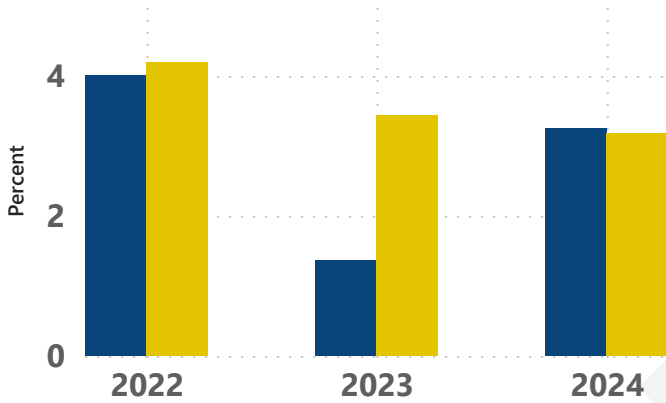

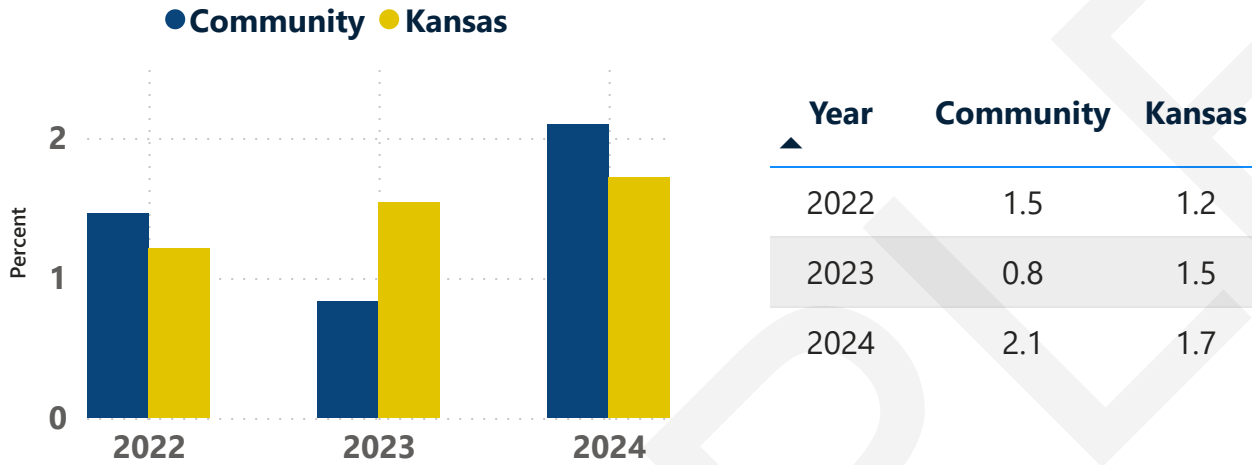

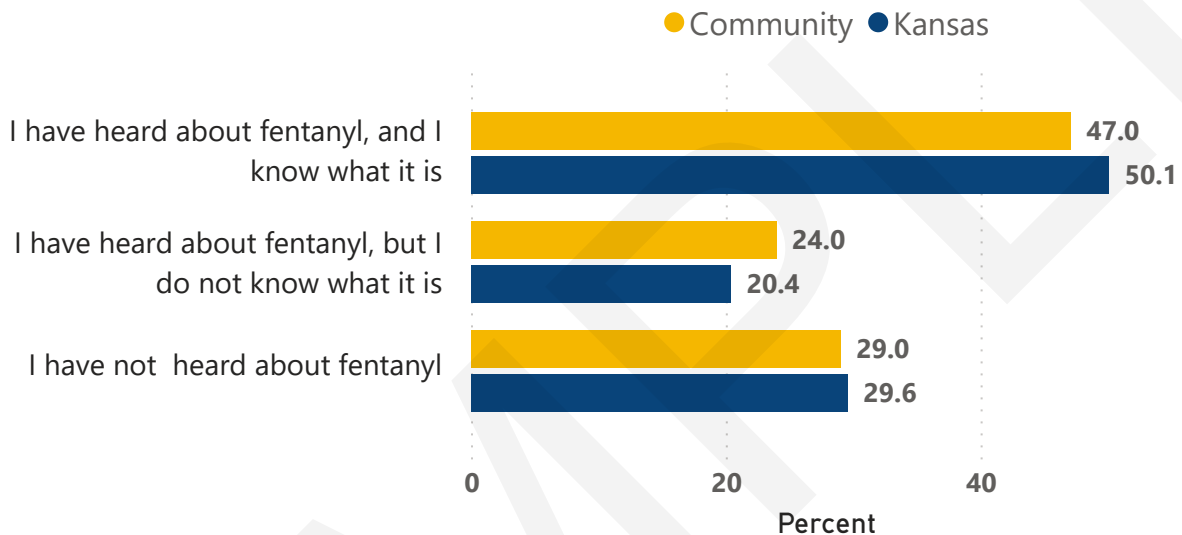

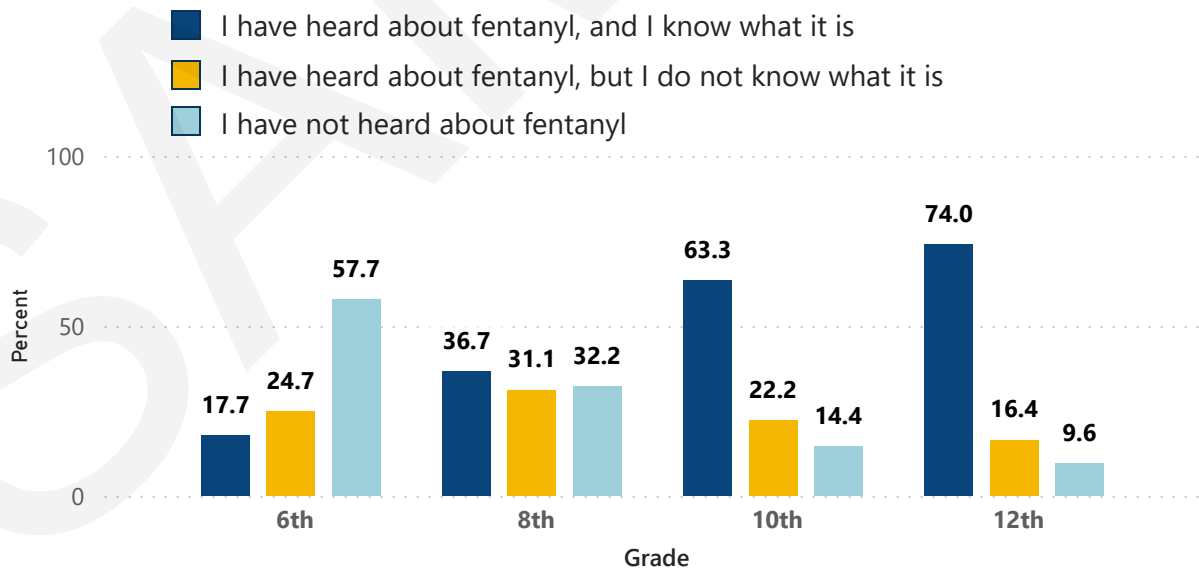
Percentage of students responding to the question

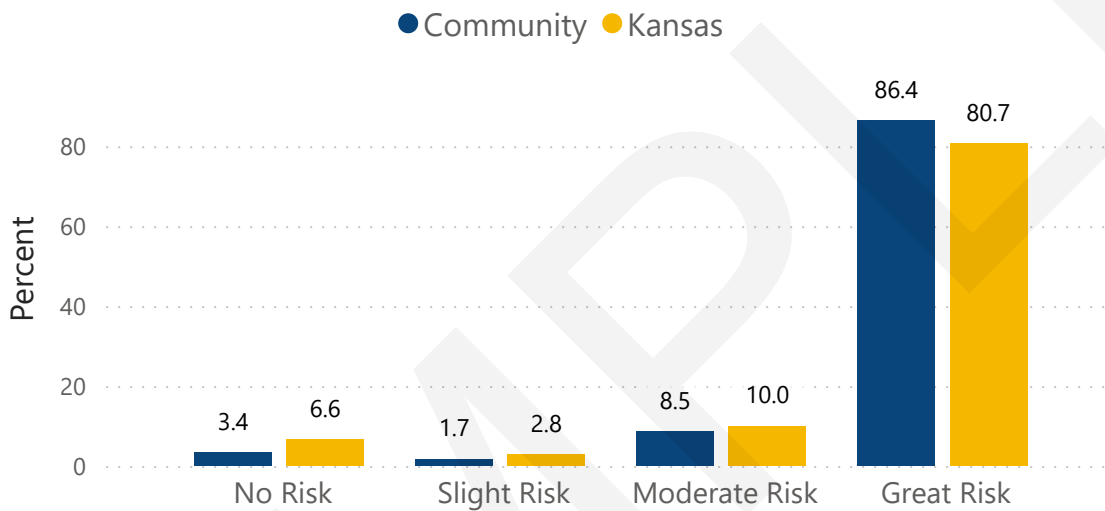

FENTANYL RISK OF HARM

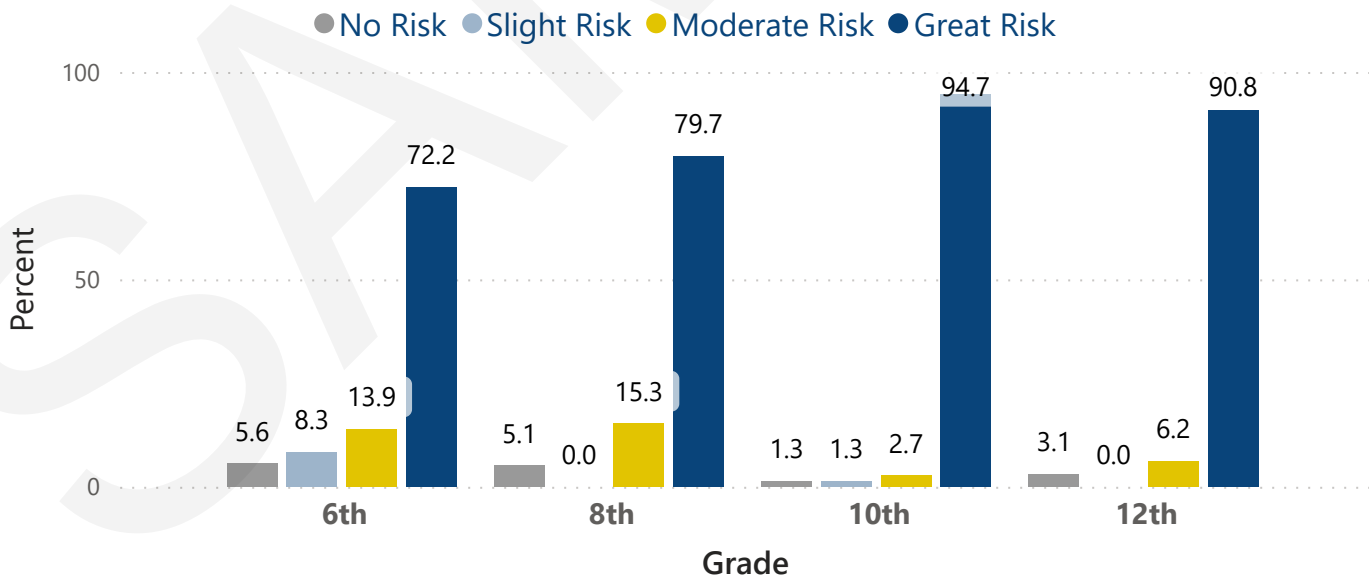
Percentage of students responding to the question

Compare how students surveyed in your community responded by grade level



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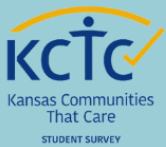
